State Director Feature

John Krsul - Building the Domestic Church



Brother Knights;

We are about to enter the last month of summer. The kids will be preparing to go to school, some families will be squeezing in the last camping trip or that long awaited vacation.

With these thoughts in mind allow me to bring to your attention Supreme Chaplain Archbishop William E. Lori's column in this July's *Columbia*. I encourage all to read it if you have not already done so. In the article the Archbishop gives excellent advice to families trying to be a domestic church during these dog days of summer and the Church in Ordinary Time. In summary he encourages families striving to be a domestic church to spend some of this diminishing leisure time serving others. In doing so families may find that time spent serving others may not turn out to be dog days, or Ordinary Time, but time well spent. In other words, do not let this period be marked by lethargy, inactivity, or indolence, the hall marks of the dog days of summer, but as the Archbishop states, "After all, Ordinary Times is meant to be a season in which we and our families internalize the great and wonderful things we celebrated during Lent, Easter, and Pentecost." And later he states, "In families that strive to be domestic churches, holiness and service are linked."

And fathers please take heed of the recommendation found in Deuteronomy 4:9, "Only be careful and watch yourselves closely so that you do not forget the things your eyes have seen or let them slip from your heart as long as you live. Teach them to your children and to their children after them". This is from the spiritual reading for August 1 found on page 214 of *Knights to Christ* written by Jerry O'Connor.

What a great thought to begin August keeping our children and grandchildren in mind as part of the domestic church.

The campaign will include the distribution of the car decal, description of its meaning, and prayer card. We want to encourage people to put them on their cars to be reminded of their commitment and support for life-long and fruitful marriage. Plus, as people drive around their cities and towns others can see the decal as a witness.

I do believe that the Knights are going to be involved in promoting and distributing the logos in parishes throughout the state. More information will come to direct the local Knights on how this process will work.

The Marriage for Life symbol represents both the **indissolubility** and **fruitfulness** of married life. Marriage expresses an unbreakable and fruitful bond—like the one Jesus Christ has with the Church.

The limbs express our need to let go and let God control our lives. We receive God with open arms and embrace and welcome each other and our children.

The **trunk** of the tree shows the unity and complementarity of the couple in marriage—they are one but both different.



The **heart** represents love—the love of the couple, family, and the heart of Christ who holds each couple and family in His Sacred Heart.

The leaves represent children and new growth. Like leaves, children collect light and produce food for the whole tree.

I pray for God's mercy and peace to each of you and your families. In His service.

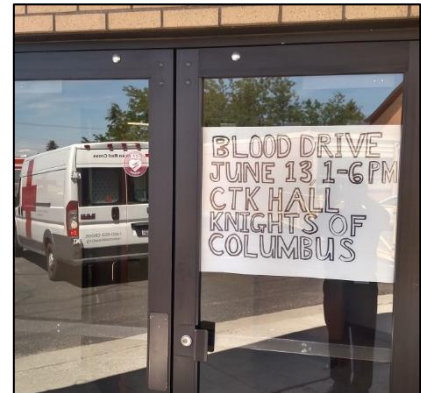
