The New State Website - Colin Groves, Administrator

We are coming up on January first, 2016, which is the roll-out date for our new State web site, "idahokofc.org". We are on schedule to have the basic site up and running. What users will see is the State "Public Affairs" home page with the "In the Spotlight" picture slider, the RSS feed from Supreme, and three pull-down lists. The first two are links to the individual Council and Assembly web sub-sites, which are modeled after the State site, and the third is a pull-down list of the State newsletters in PDF format. The "Enter the Chambers" button takes the user into the "Knights-specific" portion of the State website, where there is a gallery of officers, contact information, and ceremonial calendar. The Chambers button also accesses the same context for each individual Council and Assembly.

The foundation having been successfully laid, the real work will now begin. This will not be a static site launched with fanfare and then left to gather dust. This site has all the tools necessary to become a truly indispensable asset for every Council and Assembly in the state and we will be working with all officers to find out what adds value and then to make it so. This site will have password-protected areas where Council and Assembly officers will be able to interact with ALL the content areas and have powerful email, scheduling, and content posting tools at their disposal. They will also have internal communications tools available which will allow everyone in leadership to keep abreast of State policy and be always "on the same page".

All these capabilities will evolve according to the policies and intentions of the Knights leadership; it will truly be a product of the Knights themselves and a reflection of what we are and what we do.

The heroic efforts of brother knights in Districts 2 and 6 during the week after Christmas brought us the final recruits. *Idaho* now ranks **30th** among 72 jurisdictions.

Thus, every council is credited **\$40/member-recruited-in-Dec.** See the “Cred.” column in the Table. This credit includes the \$10 ceremonial fee that Idaho waived in December. *Boise 12172, 4013 and Idaho Falls* earned **\$200, \$160, & \$160. Well done!**

Congratulations *Meridian* and *Caldwell* for winning **20,000 VIP** points (worth \$120 in Knightsgear) from Supreme by recruiting 12 new members before Dec. 31.

Welcome to *Weiser, St. Anthony, Blackfoot, Boise 12531 and 12854*, and *Post Falls* to the ranks of the recruiting councils. Keep going!

STAR Councils receive \$4.50/billable-member. Your council's estimated STAR award is in column “Est.” At the halfway point, **12** councils are on track for **STAR**. My Dear Brothers,

I pray that you had a Blessed Christmas season and are now looking forward to many new and exciting activities during the upcoming year.

This past fraternal year, Supreme told all councils that if they became a Star Council that Supreme would credit \$4.50 for each member to their Supreme account. This meant that the Supreme per capita and Catholic advertising assessments would be paid by Supreme. Five councils in Idaho achieved Star Council and received credit from Supreme. They are: Idaho Falls Council #1663-\$900; Caldwell Council #3086-\$549; Fruitland Council #12516-\$275.50; Boise-Cathedral Council #8930-\$508.50; and Post Falls Council #12560-\$436.50. Congratulations to each of these councils.

Supreme has announced that any council who achieves Star Council this fraternal year, which ends June 30, 2016, will receive the same \$4.50 per member credit. What this amounts to is that Supreme wants to give you free per capita and Catholic advertising for your council. This will free up that much more money for your council to have to spend on charitable projects. All the council has to do is become a Star Council. There are also several membership incentives being offered by the State Council. Again, these incentives will actually enable the council to have more money for charitable work.

Every council should strive to become a Star Council. If your council has any questions about what it takes, please be sure to ask your District Deputy or any State Officer. They are there to help in any way that they can. Remember, you have six months to become a Star Council; it is not too late to start!!!!








Keep Christ in Christmas!

The Barrier

Last year's billboard location in Wendell, Idaho near I-84 was not available. The local billboard company was sympathetic and offered to provide a special deal whereby we could pick any (2) locations in Jerome, Idaho in combination with our location in Gooding, Idaho. The price offered was also attractive since a little more cash would get us (3) billboards vs. (2). The Jerome locations were great and one is even a lighted board for night time visibility, BUT... Jerome is home to another K of C council. 



The Blessing

To make a long story short, we worked with our District Deputy to get contact information for the Jerome council. During the conversation with our DD, it was clear that the bargain price for (3) boards was difficult to afford. In the end...

- ✓ The Grand Knight from Jerome offered to split the remaining cost evenly, AND
- ✓ We now we have (3) Keep Christ in Christmas billboards posted in two different cities with prominent locations which reference BOTH the Gooding & Jerome councils.



BUHL COUNCIL 2685 - SPONSORS DINNER

On November 28, the communities of Buhl and Castleford came together to hold a dinner and auction to help a long time resident, John Stiegemeier, with his medical bills. Those bills, in excess of \$85,000 after insurance, resulted from a major cardiac event with two life flights and several surgeries.

Members of our community were looking for a way to help him and his family with these bills since he could no longer work. The Buhl Knights of Columbus offered the use of the Immaculate Conception Church hall and our liability insurance to cover the event. We cooked and served the dinner consisting of tri tip, pork loin, red potatoes and string beans and dozens upon dozens of homemade cupcakes. Local residents donated money for food and collected over 120 items for the auction, with local auctioneers donating their time. The evening brought in over \$25,000!! The turnout for this event is a real tribute to the generosity of the Buhl/Castleford communities.

Many of those attending this event had never heard of the Knights of Columbus and those who had did not know what we do. Based on the thanks and comments we received, the Buhl Knights are now recognized as a major player in the support of our community.

In the New Year, Resolve to Give the Gift of Mobility

More than 10 years ago, the Knights of Columbus began participating in the Global Wheelchair Mission, sponsoring 2,000 wheelchairs to be distributed in Afghanistan. Since then, Knights throughout the world have sponsored the distribution of thousands of wheelchairs to those in need.

For every donation of \$150, the Global Wheelchair Mission can deliver a brand new wheelchair. These wheelchairs — shipped in containers of 100-280 wheelchairs each — are directly delivered to the destination countries at no cost to the recipients.

As the New Year approaches, consider implementing this program as an ongoing charitable event for your council or assembly. You might set a council-wide New Year's resolution to raise a specific dollar amount or number of wheelchairs for the Global Wheelchair Mission. Be sure to report your activities, which may help your council fulfill all four Community Activities requirements for the Columbian Award, on the *Global Wheelchair Report* (#10071).



a toll on even these sparse furnishings, as we found when only one AC unit was functioning correctly. After the AC tech got us fixed up with running units and a bill in the high triple digits (Oh yeah, when these units go out...AHH!). Now that we were moving here, we needed EVERYTHING. So, it was about a month before we could think about anything other than what we needed to get for the house and what we would do for a car. Finally, it was time for meeting people and for me that meant finding the Knights.

One Sunday in November, I saw a bunch of men in white polo shirts take over the Mass functions. Corporate Communion! I knew if I waited long enough... After Mass, I went up to the nearest one and introduced myself and was immediately surrounded by happy greeters calling me "Brother" and rattling off names that I was flat not going to remember, except for Brother Bob, who was the Faithful Navigator and the host of the Council Social to be held the following Saturday.

In the Islands, if two people meet, they greet. If three people meet, they EAT. There is even a name for this: a Mirinda (interesting etymology here, but I won't get into it.). The Social at Brother Bob's spacious house was a feast of the first order and everyone was there. Again, a fast and furious round of introductions, with more and more finally starting to stick. It ended with group pictures with my dark blue Council 1663 shirt standing out among the light blue of Santa Teresita Council 13373 (HOO-Ah!) Then, Brother Mike, the Grand Knight, handed me a Form 100 and I suddenly felt a bit sad. Council 1663 was where I joined the Knights. It was where I learned about our Four Pillars and where my Brothers taught me to live them. It was by their example that I became worthy of Idaho State Knight of the Year and here I was leaving. But then I realized I wasn't leaving, just settling in with more Brothers. I filled out the form.

Christmas in the Islands

We've all seen pictures of the coconut palms decked out in Christmas ornaments but if you're a North-North American like me, it's a bit disconcerting that Christmas isn't cold! And that's just the beginning! Home Depot and K-Mart have artificial Christmas trees...for \$400.00 and up. Home Depot had a shipment of live trees that were gone in one day and I don't even want to speculate how much THEY went for. Some people decorate their houses with Christmas lights, but Island electricity is NOT cheap. So, how is Christmas celebrated in the Islands? With friends, family and faith...as it should be.

The Council has a monthly Social which they've been doing so long it goes off like clockwork. This month, they did it in conjunction with the Corporate Mass and held it in the Church Hall. My wife made her renowned lemon meringue pie. The Chaplain Fr. Joe confided in me his weakness for lemon pie and I told him to sneak a few slices into the rectory for later, but he said all leftovers go to the battered women's shelter and he didn't want to deny the children...

Our Assembly meets on the third Wednesday of the month and Brother Bob informs us that the meeting in December will be called to order and then adjourned for...a Mirinda. We are to bring our families and pot luck sides and desserts. The Assembly would provide the meat and drinks. After the opening and a motion to adjourn made and seconded, we all sat down to eat and socialize. I'm much better at names now and my wife has made many new acquaintances as well as some old friends she hasn't seen since her teen years on the Island.

On Christmas, the entire family will meet at our Sister-in-Law's sister's place. Now THAT'S going to be Some Mirinda! My wife just came in from shopping with a little two-foot tree she found for \$5.99 at the hardware store. I guess we'll have a Christmas tree after all.

I Meet the Knights
