

I would like to share some of the most recent joys from my path to answering my vocation to the priesthood. With joy & anticipation, I am approaching the end of my time in priestly studies and formation and God-willing and with confirmation of Holy Mother Church, I will be ordained to the Transitional Diaconate within the next year.



The Order of Deacon is the first level in the Sacrament of Holy Orders before being ordained a Priest. I will be ordained to "transitional" diaconate, because a year after I will continue to the Holy Priesthood. In this sacrament, I will be making promises of chaste celibacy, obedience to our diocesan bishop, a promise to live a life of Gospel simplicity, and to pray daily the office of the Liturgy of the Hours with the Church & for the Church. In addition, I will become a minister of Baptism and Holy Matrimony and be able to preach the Word of God within the Holy Mass.





BREAKING: 'Nuisance'? Planned Parenthood sues pro-life medical center for using its own property

Planned Parenthood is suing Stanton Healthcare, a life-affirming women's medical clinic, for parking its mobile unit on Stanton's own property next to the abortion center. Membership Incentives

Supreme Knight Carl Anderson announced at the State Deputy Mid-Year Membership meeting that the Supreme membership incentive program would be renewed for the fraternal year 2016-2017. This program credits each council who achieves the Star Council Award \$4.50 per member. Councils who do not have to pay this per capita charge to Supreme will have that much more money available for council donations to charitable causes. This is another gift of money from Supreme that every council should take advantage of.

The State Council is also offering a membership incentive program for councils. Any council who recruits a new member during the months of January and February will receive a rebate on their state per capita charges. Councils who recruit new members will receive a rebate of \$9.50 for every new member that the council recruits. Winning councils must be current in all their financial responsibilities to the State Council (Ceremonials, Insurance and Per Capita). Those councils who recruit new members in January and February will be issued a check in March for \$9.50 for each new member they recruit.


The previously announced incentive awards for individual Knights remain in force throughout the remainder of this fraternal year. All members recruiting a new member will receive a copy of "Into the Breach" by Bishop Thomas Olmstead of the Diocese of Phoenix. Those who recruit a total of 3 new members will receive a padded deluxe zipper folio containing a solar calculator and the Knights of Columbus logo embossed on it. Those Knights who recruit a total of 6 new members will receive a lightweight jacket with the Knights of Columbus embroidered logo on it. The Knight who recruits the most new members, with a minimum of 10, by April 1, 2017 will receive an all-expense paid trip to the 2017 State Convention which will be held in Lewiston on April 21-23.

As of December 18, 53 Knights have earned a copy of "Into the Breach" and 5 Knights have earned the padded folio. Get yours today!!!! GROWTH IS OUR PRIMARY RESPONSIBILITY AND BUILDING THE DOMESTIC CHURCH IS ONE TOOL TO ACCOMPLISH THAT TASK

Brother Knights, following are some very sobering numbers: 1) in the United States, 1 in 3 knights or 490,000 are over the age of 70 and 14% of these are over the age of 80, 2) in all 54% are over the age of 60, 3) 360,000 knights are under the age of 60 and 24% of these are under the age of 50. In Idaho the mean age of a knight is 58.5 years. Brothers we are an aging order!

Supreme Knight Carl Anderson told the gathered state deputies at the Mid-Year Meeting held in Orlando "Our responsibility as the leaders of the Knights of Columbus is to assure the continued growth and sustainability of our Order. This is our first and primary responsibility". He continued on saying effectively this is a challenge that must be met by recruiting younger men and fathers of young families. Further he explained that our councils need to emphasize programs more relevant of families with young children and we need to use recruitment tools that rely upon enhanced internet and web-based connectivity.

This is a challenge. We surely schedule council activities as we have years of experience at doing this. But can we first identify council activities that respect the more limited time young fathers have to dedicate to volunteer activities and can we schedule council activities in ways that respond to the more limited time young fathers have to participate in activities outside the home?

Furthermore, what enhanced internet and web-based connectivity tools could be used for recruitment?

I am over 70 so I am not much help here. As I ponder these questions I realize these are \$64,000 questions. Given the demographics above most of you will know about \$64,000 questions. Unfortunately that is an excellent example of the situation. As the state council director I challenge all councils to ask members to ponder these challenges, 1) identify programs more relevant of families with young children, 2) use recruitment tools that rely upon enhanced internet and web-based connectivity, and then suggest ideas. I will collect the ideas, compile them, and submit them in the following monthly state newsletters. Please e-mail all ideas/suggestions to me at jbkrsul@cableone.net.
