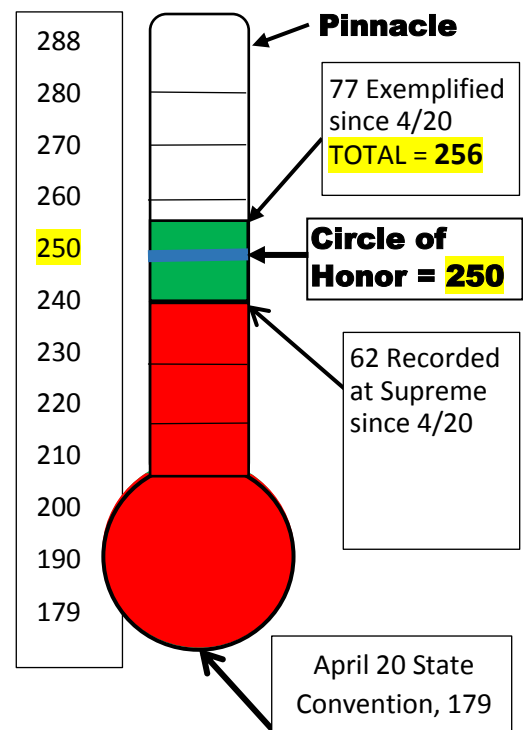

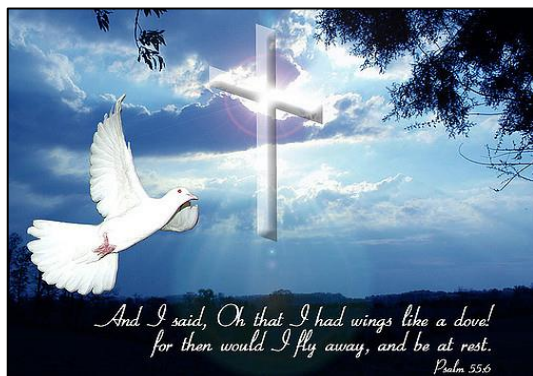

Letter to the Parishioners of St. Mark's, Boise - June 3, 2018

The recently released Pope Francis' Apostolic Exhortation, *Gaudete et Exsultate* (Rejoice and be glad [Mt 5.12]) —a must read—takes up in his fourth chapter, "Signs of Holiness in Today's World," expressions of what a person, filled with God's love, looks like in our world today. Our Holy Father calls these signs, "great expressions of love for God and neighbor." As disciples of Christ and listening to the shepherd of our Church, briefly I'll note these "expressions": 1) perseverance, patience and meekness, 2) joy and a sense of humor, 3) boldness and passion, 4) in community and 5) in constant prayer.

I see saintly men living this out with the charitable work of the Knights of Columbus here at St Mark's and around the State. Last December, I, along with Worthy State Deputy Michael Townsend and Worthy State Secretary, Shane Gehring, helped distribute wheelchairs with the oversight and assistance of the American Wheelchair Foundation and money principally raised by St Paul's parish in Nampa. Witnessing the faces of the parents and children receiving these new additions to their lives was a blessing, but the greater blessing for me, as a priest, was witnessing my brother Knights of Columbus, love and assist those in need.

Certainly it is not limited to 'mission' trips that we are able to witness faith alive in our brother Knights. We see their holiness with the 40 Cans for Lent food drive, corporate communions, the March for Life, fundraising for ultrasound machines, promotion and fundraising for our seminarians, assisting in the nursing homes and the Silver Rose Processions (watch for the next one -June 21st!). I have personally been blessed to experience the saintly work of the Knights in a deeper way recently, as they have assisted me during my recovery from a concussion.

I see my brother Knights as men living their encountered love of Christ in community, perpetually being men of work and prayer. You've been a gift to my faith and the countless men, women and children who witness your expressions of faith alive as a Knight of Columbus. Thank you, for your great expressions of love for God and neighbor.

Is the Fourth Degree still relevant? Yes! Here's why!

Speech presented at the Washington State Convention - May 20, 2018 in Pasco, WA

With the change of the Fourth Degree Regalia, I have heard many questions asked by long-time members and even Assembly leaders. Some of those most disillusioned by this change of have asked in various ways and forms: Is the Fourth Degree still relevant? What is the point if we can't show our accustomed flash? It is just another meeting, another set of paperwork and another dues payment so why bother anymore?

My answer is YES! That our mission, our purpose, our mandate has not changed and has perhaps even been clarified.

Too often in the recent past and in many Assemblies, the Fourth Degree is just a social club. An excuse to dress up once a month and go out to dinner with our wives. While such a family activity does indeed fall within the greater mission of the Knights of Columbus, it must not be the sole mission of the Fourth Degree.

More often, the Fourth Degree provides the color and the pomp to celebrations of new life such as First Communions, Confirmation, Marriages and Ordinations and unfortunately frequently and but as importantly, to celebrations of lives-well-spent as we provide a final escort and salute to our Brother Knights and family members. While this time-honored and important display of Charity, Unity and Fraternity IS important and well within the greater mission of the Knights of Columbus, it cannot be the sole mission of the Fourth Degree.

The mission of the Fourth Degree is now and always has been Patriotism and Evangelization regardless of what we are wearing.

In a recent survey, 34% of those responding said the 1st Amendment of the Constitution "goes too far in the rights it guarantees".

When asked what specific rights the First Amendment guaranteed, 59% named Freedom of Speech, 24% named Freedom of Religion, 14% named Freedom of the Press, 11% named Right Peaceably to Assemble and only 4%, 1 in 25 knew about their Right to Petition the Government.

31% said musicians should not be all to sing songs with lyrics that might offend others.

44% said the government should be able to force journalists to reveal their sources.

36% could not name one, just one, of the five individual freedoms guaranteed by the First Amendment.

In another survey, only 33% of those asked could correctly identify the Bill of Rights as the first 10 amendments to the Constitution and only 9% knew or guessed from the multiple-choice survey that original purpose of the Bill of Rights was limit abuses by the Government.

In a 2017 survey on the Constitution, only 26% could name all three branches of the government and 33% could not name ANY of the three branches, not even one.

A Pew Research Center poll in 2010 asked the name of the Chief Justice of the Supreme Court and only 28% named John Roberts. Of the 72% who didn't name Roberts, 53% had no idea, 8% guessed Thurgood Marshall who was never Chief Justice and had been dead for 17 years when the poll was conducted and 4% named Harry Reid who was NEVER a Supreme Court Justice. Finally, in a poll from July of 2000, only 51% of those polled would vote for the Constitution if it were presented as written in ballot form. 22% would vote against the Constitution and 27% just don't know.

How do we protect and defend something we don't understand or appreciate?

Gentlemen, the purpose of the Fourth Degree is to teach those around us about our government and the mechanisms which guarantee our Freedoms and our very Liberty.

According to a 2008 poll of American Catholics only 23% of American Catholics attended Mass on a weekly basis and of that 23%, only 91% believe in the Real Presence of Jesus Christ in the Eucharist. The number falls to only 65% in those who attend Mass monthly and is even less for those who attend rarely. Among weekly attendees, only 62% receive Confession at least once a year, a basic precept of the Church.

Quite often I feel bad during the Knighthood Degree when I tell 2nd Degree candidates “you were taught all these things...” because I was **not** taught all of these things and most of what I was taught came not from CCD or directly from the Church but from my mother who thought she was supplementing CCD. When I took my daughter to CCD, she was taught the same things I was: “Jesus loves you and be nice to others” so I thought I was good, I had done my duty. Unfortunately, it shows in her beliefs and attitudes toward the Faith today. In her later life, my mother was shocked at how little I and my siblings knew and had been taught. She thought she had done her duty towards us. To her dying day she grieved the loss of faith in my brothers and the fact that her grandkids were not all baptized in the Church. I have much higher hopes for my grandsons but they are so far away from me and the tug of society is so very strong.

The new Evangelization is not just using new forms of media to spread the word. It really means to re-evangelize those who have received the Gospel but who have or are experiencing a crisis of faith or who were badly catechized and never really got it the first time.

Gentlemen, the purpose of the Fourth Degree is to inspire those around us to know and practice our faith as taught by Christ and by the Church in the Catechism.

Statistically and historically, when a member advances to the Fourth Degree, the chances of him suspending out or withdrawing from the Order has been very small. That is still true although this last year HAS been a bit of a test on that premise.

None the less Gentlemen, the purpose of the Fourth Degree is the stability of our Order.

When I was District Master, I attended my Council meeting prior to a Fourth Degree Exemplification. My intent was to gauge interest in the upcoming exemplification and to recruit toward it. When I surveyed the members in attendance, 18 of the 19 present were already Fourth Degree Knights. The 19th member had a specific reason for not being Fourth Degree although he did join once his promise was fulfilled and that reason had passed.

At your next Council meeting, ask all the Officers, past or present, who are Fourth Degree members to stand up and at your next Fourth Degree Meeting, have all the members who have at one time been or are currently officers in your Council or leaders in your Parish to please stand.

What I expect you will find is that the purpose and more specifically the result of the Fourth Degree is LEADERSHIP. Gentlemen, the Fourth Degree is now and always has been **what we do and has never been more relevant.** Vivat Jesus.

Church vs. State

As we approach the anniversary of our Declaration of Independence from Britain rule, I wanted to share with you an article from The Atlantic magazine. This article talks about the political debate that was occurring as an Irish-Catholic politician was ascending the ranks of the New York political hierarchy.

Alfred E. Smith was then Governor of New York, son of Irish mother and Civil War veteran father, he was raised and lived in a good Catholic home by the Brooklyn Bridge.

As his political life continued to the point of being Governor of New York, many of the Protestant members of the media took note of his possible aspirations of being POTUS. The media took it upon themselves to warn the populous of this pending so-called disaster. By disaster, I mean that people feared that if a Catholic were to assume the Presidency, then his life's political direction was to be guided by the Vatican and thus the country would live and rule by Catholic dogma.

'Render therefore unto Caesar the things that are Caesar's: and unto God the things that are God's.' This passage was used by the media to create fear in its readers about the separation of Church and State.

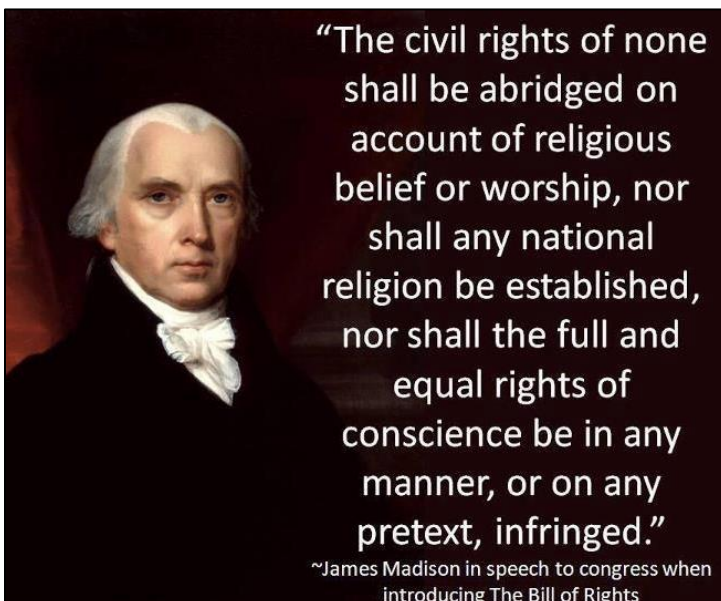
Alfred E. Smith did go on to be the Democratic candidate for Presidency in 1928. He was the first Catholic to run for the Presidency of the United States.

This political scenario described here is shortly after the creation of the Knights of Columbus in 1882. At the time of the founding of our Order, the persecution of Irish Catholics was rampant and wide spread. I think that this shows that the

discrimination that still pervaded the country at that time, while conversely showed that the country was becoming more accepting of the immigrant Irish Catholic.

We are a country founded and grown by immigrants, and will continue to be. Provided that we are accepting and welcoming of our future immigrant population and work for assimilation into the American culture.

Remember, that we are Americans first, not Irish, Africans or Latinos etc. Vivat Jesus.

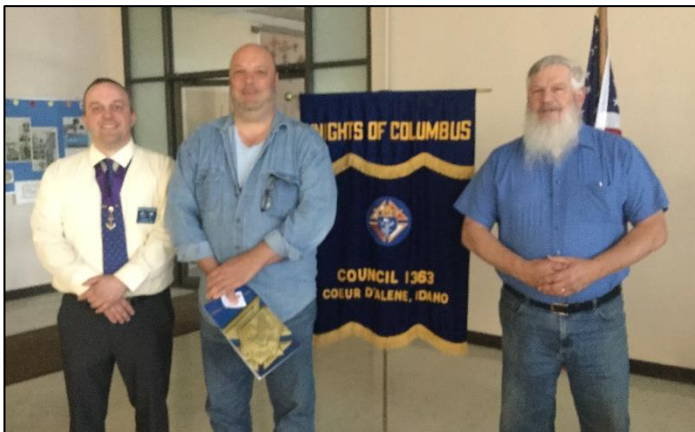

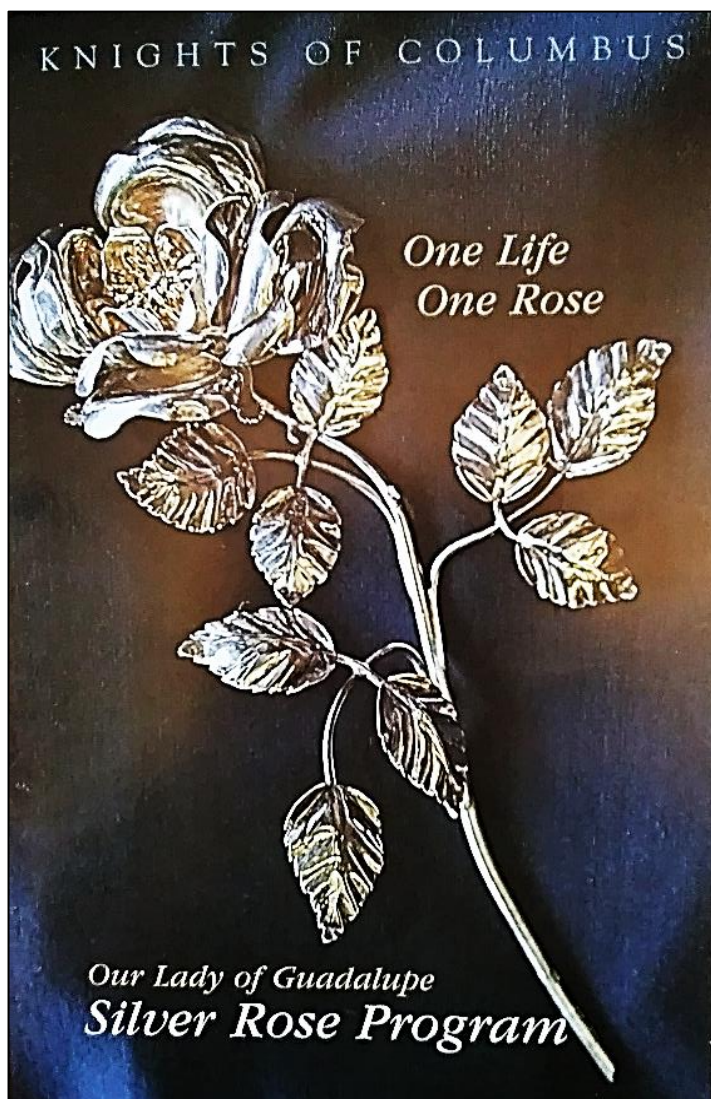
Brother Knights of St. Mary's Council -

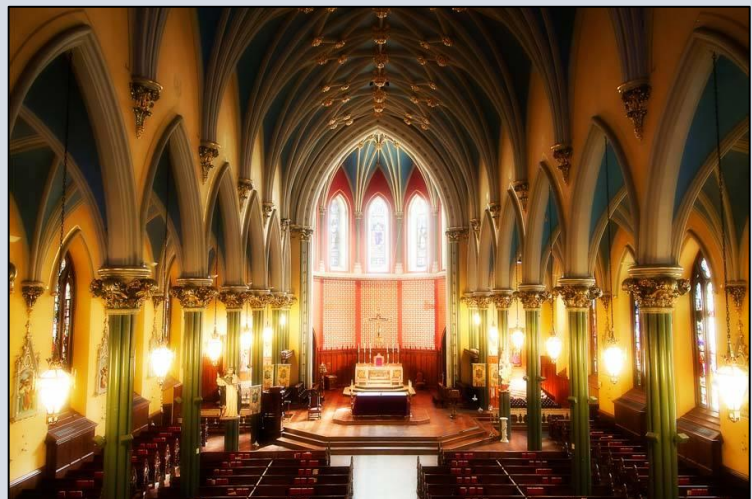
