

SUPREME CHAPLAIN ARCHBISHOP LORI


*Jesus said to his disciples,

KNIGHTS OF COLUMBUS SILVER ROSE TOUR - IDAHO

Our Lady of Guadalupe Silver Rose has been a Knights of Columbus tradition for 59 years. In 1960, groups of Columbian Squires in Mexico, Canada and the United States decided to honor Our Lady of Guadalupe by carrying a rose across North America from Canada to the Basilica of Our Lady of Guadalupe in Monterrey, Mexico. In 2001 Supreme Knight Carl A. Anderson, at the 119th Supreme Council Meeting in Toronto, addressed the effort in culture of life terms, referring to the Our Lady of Guadalupe - One Life, One Rose Program. He urged that it be expanded to every North American jurisdiction.



In recent years, the program has expanded from three to eight silver roses traveling the western, central, and eastern corridors of North America, with Knights of Columbus from Canada to Mexico carrying the roses from destination to destination, and finally to the Shrine of Our Lady of Guadalupe in Monterrey, Mexico.


