
The event will include:





This is a great way to spread both love of country and love of God.




Memorial Day

Dear Knights of Columbus, Idaho Councils;

It is with much humility that we invoke your help for the deacons within the Diocese of Boise. The ordained deacons of Idaho have a very limited budget from the Diocese with most of the money going to the deacon formation program. Any help for deacon widows, care for sick deacons or monetary assistance is from the ordained brother deacons. It is our hope through reaching out to the Knights that the need for help won't fall solely on the ordained brothers.

The cost to go through the deacon formation program, out of pocket expense, ranges from \$5,000 to \$10,000, depending on location. The time investment is 5- 20 hours per week while studying. When finally ordained, the payments received for services and time is nonexistent in most cases. Granted, almost all of the ordained brothers would not ask for anything else and are happy to serve, doing what God called them to do!

With that said though, it is our hope to ease the monetary exposure of the ordained deacons by asking for your assistance. The donation from your council would be greatly appreciated and would go directly to the Diocese of Boise Deacon fund. The fund will be used to help the needs of deacon widows and their families, and the needs of our many faithful deacons as well.



This low-pressure, low-commitment and digital experience meets men where they are, helps to form them as Catholic men, and enables us to bring more men into the fold.

An Amplified Message – The Online Membership initiative is backed by a substantial marketing campaign that will find and work to convert prospective members”.

Online membership was launched in Idaho on May 21st. I challenge each and every one to go to the KofC.org. Click on Membership in the upper right hand corner then click on Online Membership. There you will find out all that you will need to know. Then go out and get a Catholic man to sign up for online membership.

Assembly Actions

John Pettinger PSD - Idaho District Master

Brothers,

In this newsletter I will discuss future Fourth Degree exemplifications, the results of the biannual meeting, ordination of new priests for the diocese, the rescheduled Guadalupe Festival, and availability of new uniforms.

The final exemplification for this fraternal year is in Boise on June 2 at St. Mark's. It is time to start planning dates and host assemblies for the 2018/2019 fraternal year. I have already been approached by Twin Falls to host in southern Idaho (probably in April 2019). I will be looking for hosts in northern Idaho (during October or November 2018) and in central Idaho (in January and June 2019). Please let me know if you are interested in hosting a Fourth Degree exemplification in your location.

The biannual meeting of the Fourth Degree was held before the start of the state convention on April 20. Three names were submitted to our Vice Supreme Master for consideration by Supreme for appointment as District Master: myself, Kerry Hennessy, and Dave Ellingsen. We held a discussion, then submitted a resolution for Supreme to consider a sword baldric for the Color Corps that, by its color, would indicate the office held by its wearer. This would be an alternative to the colors of the capes previously worn as regalia. We also discussed the need for assemblies to do year-round recruiting to the Fourth Degree so that when exemplifications are scheduled, we are not scrambling to find candidates for the lesson of the Fourth Degree. This will eliminate cancellation of exemplifications for lack of candidates. To protect the Master's Fund, which only receives monies from candidate fees, we must have a minimum of 12 candidates for each exemplification held.

On June 7, Bishop Peter will be ordaining two new priests and one transitional deacon at St. John Cathedral. As usual, the Color Corps has been invited to participate in the Mass of Ordination. All Knights are encouraged to come and support these new priests who are so desperately needed in our diocese. Color Corps members should plan to arrive at the Cathedral by 10 AM for instruction and dressing. Both uniforms and regalia are welcome.

The Guadalupe Festival originally scheduled for June 23rd has been postponed until September 15 due to a conflict with the schedule of our featured speaker, Monsignor Eduardo Chavez, the postulator for the sainthood of Saint Juan Diego. The new date will fall on Mexican Independence Day. The Color Corps has been asked to provide an Honor Guard and security for the relics of Mexican martyrs which will be on display during the festival. We need both Color Corps members and any Knights that are willing to be in the presence of the relics to ensure their safety while in our care. Please contact me if you can help. I hope to have enough volunteers that everyone will only have one or two hours on duty during the day.



Delivering Hope, One Wheelchair at a Time

Last December Knights from Idaho traveled to Guadalajara, Mexico, to deliver wheelchairs to the poorest of the poor, children and adults, who desperately need assistance with mobility. The wheelchairs were sponsored by Idaho Knights. State Deputy Mike Townsend, Fr. Ben Uhlenkott, Shane Gehring and Dan Moberg were all touched deeply by the need of those who were visited, as well as the love and outpouring of gratitude from those who received wheelchairs and from their families and loved ones. State Secretary Shane said that "It was a life changing experience" and he hopes that more Knights from Idaho, and their families, will take advantage of the next opportunity to enjoy this experience. That experience is currently in the works.



This year the target wheelchair project is to deliver a container of wheelchairs to Mexico City in an effort to bring life-changing hope to the poorest of the poor in the city of Our Lady of Guadalupe, our Mother of the Americas. We will be delivering wheelchairs to the children at the children's rehabilitation center(s) in the greater Mexico City area. It will depend on how many wheelchairs we sponsor as to how many CRIT centers we will be able to assist. We will also take time to tour Tepeyac Hill and visit the actual places where the apparitions occurred; and we will visit the Basilica of Our Lady of Guadalupe, attend Mass there and view the Tilma of St. Juan Diego containing the image of Our Lady.

In order for this to happen, we need your help. We encourage every council to donate to the cause. Every \$150.00 delivers one wheelchair and we need at least 280 wheelchairs to fill one container. So, we ask you to be as generous as possible. Please consider a "Wheelchair Sunday", where we will come to your parish and deliver a 10 minute presentation during all of the Saturday and Sunday Masses. This is a highly successful program and I would love to tell you all about it. Please call or e-mail me with questions. Please help us bring hope to the poorest of the poor. Thank you and God bless.

- Reduce the number of programs required to earn the Columbian Award to 16 (four programs in four categories).
- Introduce nine new programs.
