Patriotism and True Americanism

We all know that the 4th Degree of our Order is Patriotism...But do we understand what true Americanism is? Or do we succumb to the secular idea of what America should be? 81 years ago, this month, then-Father Fulton Sheen discussed this very topic on *The Catholic Hour* radio program:

"True Americanism is the belief in the freedom of man as a divine derivative. For that reason if we wish to keep pure Americanism we must keep our religion. To this is to be added the important fact that dictatorships, such as the Communistic, regard man only as a stomach to be fed by the State. Put men on that level and they need no religion. But to put them on that level is to de-personalize and mechanize them down to the very core of their being. A democracy needs religion, for it assumes that man has not only a stomach but also a soul which is the seat of his rights; and since that soul must be fed as well as the body, he must have religion. Democracy has to rely not on force, but on freedom and liberty. But freedom and liberty are inseparable from responsibility, and responsibility is inseparable from conscience, and conscience is inseparable from religion. It is our solemn duty as Catholics, therefore, to be conscious of our duty to America, and to preserve its freedom by preserving its faith in God... But as we talk about patriotism, it might be well to remind ourselves that [...] devotion to the stars and stripes is not enough to save us. We must look beyond them to other stars and stripes, namely the stars and stripes of Christ, by Whose stars we are illuminated and by whose stripes we are healed!"

This 1938 message is just as important today. We must promote "True Americanism" to ensure God remains relevant in our communities and not pushed out by advocates of relativistic Americanism.

Top 5 Questions You've Wanted to Ask About K of C Insurance

1. How does K of C life insurance work?

By purchasing a K of C life insurance policy and paying premiums you ensure that when you die, your beneficiary (or beneficiaries) will receive a lump sum, also known as a death benefit.

If you leave your company, you cannot take your life insurance with you. It's important to review your insurance policy periodically to make sure it still meets your financial needs.

5. I have K of C insurance; where can I find my current policy?

It's easy. Simply contact your K of C agent to discuss the details of your current policy or annuity values. Find your local agent by visiting kofc.org/findagent.



A CHALLENGE AND MESSAGE FROM SUPREME CHAPLAIN ARCHBISHOP LORI

*Jesus said to Simon, “Do not be afraid;
from now on you will be catching men.”*

*When they brought their boats to the shore,
they left everything and followed him.*

— Gospel for Feb. 10, Lk 5:10-11

“They left everything and followed him.” My brothers, these words shock me every time I hear or read them. If we are honest, we have to admit how hard it is to leave everything to follow Jesus. After all, we are so good at taking stuff with us as we attempt to follow him — our pride, our possessions, our desire for power, more comfort and pleasure. We attempt to drag this heavy luggage along, or sometimes try to sneak little trinkets into our bags to take with us: maybe it's our wandering eyes, our temper, a critical spirit, or our workaholicism. But Jesus and his disciples travel lightly. He invites us to leave everything and follow him. Let's experience this genuine freedom of being his disciple: a freedom which hits the open road with our Lord, free of everything that hinders us.

Brothers and Sir Knights,

There are a few events coming in which the Color Corps members throughout the state will have an opportunity to participate. I hope that as many of you as are able will choose to take advantage of them.

The Idaho Catholic Youth Conference will take place at the Ford Idaho Sport Center in Nampa on March 8—10. As usual, the Fourth Degree Knights will provide an Honor Guard. I am expecting that Knights from around the state will attend as chaperones for the youth attending the conference. If you are planning to attend the conference and would like to participate in new or old-style regalia, we welcome you to join us for the closing Mass on Sunday, March 10. This is a wonderful chance to be visible to our youth and perhaps influence some future Knights.

Idaho is blessed to welcome the incorruptible heart relic of St. Jean Marie Vianney (the patron saint of priests) to Idaho Falls on March 27 and to Pocatello on March 28. Christ the King parish will have veneration from noon until 7 p.m., then St. Joseph's veneration will occur from 10 a.m. until 6 p.m. In both locations, we hope to have an Honor Guard for procession in, and out, of the churches as well as provide a security guard for the relic.

Saturday, March 30, will be the next Fourth Degree exemplification to be held in Idaho Falls at Christ the King parish hall. Candidates should register as soon as possible in preparation. As with any exemplification, we need Color Corps to present the Colors at the ceremony, assist as row guards for the candidates, be there to support the new Sir Knights, and process into Mass following the ceremony. A letter with details will be sent to Grand Knights and Faithful Navigators soon. Following close behind will be an exemplification in Twin Falls on May 5 (Sunday). June will be another priest ordination at St. John cathedral in Boise. More details to follow.

I am happy to announce that the Fourth Degree exemplifications held in Boise and Lewiston on February 2nd and 9th (respectively) advanced 22 members to the honors of Sir Knight. Three additional members from Clarkston, Washington were also advanced. It was a real pleasure for me to return a favor for the Eastern Washington District Master who has advanced many members in the Idaho panhandle at exemplifications held in Spokane.
