


We did our Supreme's church drive weekend last weekend and have a list of 10 possibilities new or mostly of transfers to be added within the next month.



Congratulations to the *four* councils that have already reached Star-Level membership. Job well done! **Boise Council 4012**, **Fruitland 12516**, and **Caldwell 3086** have attained **100%** while **Salmon Council 8283** ascended to **125%** despite tragic circumstances. You are the leaders by example for all of Idaho. Keep moving on with the other requirements of Star Council, particularly the Columbian and Fr. McGivney Awards, to ensure you will qualify for Star.

Some Councils are already making outstanding progress toward the Fr. McGivney Awards. Three councils have already exceeded or attained their insurance goal: Pocatello 8930 at 167%, Nampa 2014 at 140%, and Mountain Home 3841 at 100%. Congratulations to you and your field agents. Excellent work!

Thank you for making **October** one of Idaho's recruiting best months in years. We went from 48th to 39th place (among 72 jurisdictions) in the final week. We recognize heroic efforts by many Grand Knights, Financial Secretaries, and District Deputies. **Twenty-two** Idahoans joined the Knights of Columbus in **October**. That is 8% of our yearly goal and achieves a Supreme monetary award. Each council will receive money in accordance with the number of new members they recruited in October. Still, only 18 of our 44 councils have recruited a new knight this year. Imagine what we'll do when the other 26 join in!


