### New K of C Documentary on Mercy to Air on ABC



Among the stories shared in the documentary is that of Jennifer Trapuzzano, here pictured with her 2-year-old daughter, Cecilia. Jennifer was 9 months pregnant with Cecilia when her husband Nathan was killed during an attempted robbery.

April 1, 2014. Jennifer has since publicly forgiven her husband's murderer, speaking of mercy at his sentence hearing.

The Knights of Columbus' new documentary film, *The Face of Mercy*, will air on ABC affiliates across the U.S. from Oct. 16 to Dec. 16.

Narrated by Jim Caviezel, *The Face of Mercy* explores the history and relevance of Divine Mercy in our turbulent times. Watch its story unfold, from the Polish nun who received powerful visions of a merciful God, to her countryman Pope John Paul II, and to Pope Francis' declaration of the Year of Mercy. Meet a woman who found freedom in forgiveness after seeing her family wiped out by genocide, a former-NFL linebacker who walked away from football to share Christ's mercy with the homeless, a baseball player who traded MLB ambitions for the monastery, a priest with a drug-dealing past and a young widow who chose mercy toward her husband's killer.

## Building the Domestic Church



In the October issue of *First Things* a journal published by the Institute on Religion and Public Life, the editor states the following : “A renewal of marriage and revival of faith isn’t that a pipe dream?”.

He goes on detailing cultural and political changes that make one feel that such a renewal is indeed a pipe dream. He does offer a chance for renewal in communities bound in faith, hope and charity. Even Pope Francis asks in *Amoris Laetitia* the following question: “Who is making an effort to strengthen marriages, to help married couples overcome their problems, to assist them in the work of raising children and, in general, to encourage stability of the marriage bond?”

One answer is that we, the Knights of Columbus, are making an effort. After all we are a community bound by faith, hope, and charity. We are already familiar with Building the Domestic Church programs. But we are doing other things as we have been for decades. For instance, just prior to the publishing of this newsletter we will have assisted Bishop Peter Christensen launch a new diocesan campaign called 'Marriage for Life'.

Through this campaign decals designed to show that marriage is to be lived for the whole life and for the purpose of having and raising children will have been distributed by Knights at Masses on October 22<sup>nd</sup> and 23<sup>rd</sup>. With respect to the decals there are two excellent articles in the October 7-20, 2016 *Idaho Catholic Register*. In Bishop Christensen’s “Just a Thought” column he discusses the symbolism of the decal design and his vision on how the message will be displayed to be seen by many. The second article under the “Marriage for Life” column, Jay Wonacott, Director, Diocesan Marriage & Family Life Office, further details the meaning of the decal.

If you have not already read these fine columns, I strongly urge you to do so now. Please display the decal prominently to show your support for Marriage for Life. And finally, Bishop Peter Christensen’s campaign fits in so well with the November theme found in the booklet *Building the Domestic Church: The Family Fully Alive*. On page 8 you will find the following statement: “Our family defines each and every one of us. Because our parents, grandparents, and great-grandparents chose life, we are here today.

This month, thank God for the gift of your family. Unfortunately for many that have bought into the secular religion of our time, there will be no family to thank God for! Keep in mind that as a Knight you have chosen to play a role to strengthen marriage. Prepare yourself to fulfill that role and show that the pipe dream is in fact natural reality that cannot be denied.

### ROBERT HERRIN III

My name is Robert Herrin III and I was born 5 December 1971 in Hattiesburg, Mississippi. I was baptized as a "cradle catholic" at Sacred Heart Church in Hattiesburg, Mississippi (ironic since now I go to Sacred Heart in Boise). I grew up in and spent a good portion of my life in Mississippi and call it my "home away from home" but Boise is my "true" home, as my immediate family is here.

I am married to a most lovely lady name Delisa I. Herrin. She was born in Mountain View, California, but is really an Idahoan as she was raised and spent most of her life here. I have three stepchildren and one grandson.

I grew up in Mississippi and spent my school years in Ellisville. I went to Immaculate Conception Catholic Church in Laurel, which was about 10 to 15 miles away from Ellisville. At age 16, I became a charter member of the Squires Circle in Laurel, Mississippi, which was sponsored Knights of Columbus Council #2180. I would not trade my time in the military for anything in the world. It helped me to round out my journey through the 4<sup>th</sup> Degree (Patriotic Degree). I even took my 4<sup>th</sup> Degree in my military dress uniform in 1996.

In May of 2002, I made the move to Boise, transferring my military status to Gowen Field. I fell in love with the area and this part of the country as well as meeting my future wife here. In September of 2002 my wife and I were married at Saint John's Cathedral. I completed my service in May 2014 with 25 years in the Army.

After retiring from the Army I continued my experience with Automated Logistics and Information Technology (IT) in the civilian sector, working for a company called iTradeNetwork as an Application Engineer. I have been there since May of 2014 and my most current position is serving as an Integration Quality Assurance Engineer (QA). I enjoy the work as I am technical in nature and it allows me to express that in the IT environment. I have extensive experience in the Computer Industry serving previously as a System Administrator, Software Developer and direct Customer Support Technician.

A Global Wheelchair Mission Partner

Did you know that Idaho's "Sister State" in Mexico is Jalisco? In Jalisco the city of Guadalajara is home to just one of the twenty-three children's rehabilitation centers located throughout Mexico. These centers, called "CRIT" are providing rehabilitative services for thousands of children who suffer from neuromuscular disorders, who come from the poorest of the poor families. Although these CRIT centers are providing modern therapeutic services with state-of-the-art equipment, when the children leave the facility, they leave with what they came—nothing.

For the past several years, The American Wheelchair Mission, with the generous charity from Knights of Columbus, have been providing thousands of brand new wheelchairs to these children to take home so that their lives and the lives of their loved ones, will be enhanced wherever they may go. Knights, like those in Idaho, are answering their prayers and bringing them hope.

In January of 2016, our Supreme Knight, Carl Anderson, his wife, Dorian, and the Supreme Officers and Board Members and their families took part in a distribution of over 100 wheelchairs to those in need at the Basilica of Our Lady of Guadalupe in Mexico City. Supreme Knight Anderson presented the 50,000th Knights sponsored wheelchair to 10 year old, Arturo Martinez. Without this gift of hope for Arturo and his family, Arturo could not go to school, he could not take part in childhood activities and his future would be extremely limited.



Last year, Idaho Knights banded together to provide wheelchairs for veterans and the Honor Flight program. This year, we are working together to provide wheelchairs for the children at the CRIT center in Guadalajara. Please consider making a generous contribution towards this effort. ## HERMIT IN THE HIGH DESERT OF IDAHO


Marymount Hermitage is home to the Hermit Sisters of Mary. It is located in Mesa, Idaho which is along Highway 95, between Weiser and New Meadows. Sister Rebecca Mary and I founded Marymount Hermitage over 32 years ago. We were invited to the Diocese of Boise in 1981 by Bishop Sylvester Treinen whom we revere as our founding bishop. We felt called by God to live in solitude and silence for the sake of unceasing prayer for the salvation of souls, the good of the Church and the world. Ours is a life of sacrifice and austerity; it is also a privilege and a joy for the love of God. I believe that our peace and presence to people, whom we do meet and talk with, is a reminder that there is a God and He can make a person fulfilled and happy. Wearing our religious habit adds to this public witness.

Marymount Hermitage is situated on 100 acres of ranch land and the campus has 10 buildings. Originally planned for a community of Hermit Sisters, over the years we have opened the five hermitages for use by retreatants. Even though, because of old age and ill health, Sister Rebecca Mary has returned to the community from which we came in Beaverton, Oregon, there is still a praying community here on the mesa. Neighbors and retreatants join me for Lauds, Vespers and holy hours of Adoration. Another important member of our praying community is Mary Chamberlin, who moved to Marymount two years ago, and is our first resident Lay Associate. She is a great support to me in the daily task of maintaining the buildings and grounds.

Bishop Treinen had many wise sayings, one of which was, "If you work hard, people will be willing to help you. I have found this to be true. Fees from retreatants basically maintain the buildings. I make items to sell and have made a business doing this in the Treasure Valley parishes. I also make myself available to teach or give retreats at Nazareth Retreat Center in Boise and in parishes throughout the Pacific Northwest. This income provides me and Marymount with what I need for operating expenses. Besides this, generous individuals or families donate monthly. Since Marymount Hermitage is a non-profit corporation, all donations are tax deductible. I have Mass offered once a month for our benefactors. The Knights of Columbus from Risen Christ, Sacred Heart and St. Mary's parishes in Boise, Holy Apostles in Meridian, and St. Agnes in Weiser have been very generous over the years sending work crews once or twice a year to do maintenance chores. Mike Townsend fondly recalls the photo I took of him hanging off the bell tower in an attempt to power wash it!

After prayerful deliberation, consultation with Bishop Christensen and our Board of Directors, we have decided that circumstances require us to build a new library and house of hospitality. The new building will be called Mercy House to commemorate the Extraordinary Jubilee Year of Mercy. It will be dedicated to Pope St. John Paul II, St. Teresa of

Calcutta, and St. Faustina, our great new saints of mercy. **Save the date: October 25, 2017.** Bishop Peter Christensen will offer Mass at Marymount Hermitage at 11 AM to celebrate the faithfulness of God to me on the occasion of my 50<sup>th</sup> Jubilee and, God willing, will bless the new building. John Pettinger has offered to have an Honor Guard for the Mass, as he did for our 25<sup>th</sup> Anniversary Mass in 2009. I am currently doing fund raising for construction to begin in the spring of 2017. The campaign goal is \$213,000. We have over \$40,000 to date. Risen Christ Council of KC's contributed \$500. Please visit the website for more information about Marymount Hermitage and the Library. You can read my letter and the letter Bishop Peter wrote in support of this project.
